The Pangea Network, founded in 2005, is an international non-profit dedicated to empowering motivated individuals in Kenya and the United States with the knowledge, skills, and an ongoing network of support in order to achieve their dreams and make positive, life-changing contributions in the communities where they live.

The Pangea Network's U.S. program, The Young Women's Leadership Challenge (YWLC), was created in 2012 to inspire high school girls in the U.S. to take action in their local and global communities, YWLC starts with a 6-day intensive leadership conference and is followed by a year of activities including volunteering, trainings, and Pangea's signature Take Action Challenge (TAC).





Take Action Challenge Presentations + Plan the Work for the Year Ahead



Take Action Challenge (TAC)

- By the last day of the summer conference, you will have written out the blueprint and plan of action of your personal project called "The Take Action Challenge" or TAC
- The TAC asks every participant to design and implement an action in their community or the world and Pangea has seen incredible results.
- · You will have I-year to complete your TAC which you will implement during the Fall and Spring semester

80% of participants received a scholarship to attend YWLC in 2017.

68% increase in program participants from 2016 to 2017.
